	Lizards like lollipops – /l/, /l/, /l/. (pronounced /l/ as in lizard)	Mime holding a lollipop and licking it.		
	Mummy on the moon – /m/, /m/, /m/. (pronounced /m/ as in moon)	Bounce outstretched arms as if moving in a low gravity environment.		
	Nanny has a net – / <b>n</b> /, / <b>n</b> /, / <b>n</b> /. (pronounced / <b>n</b> / as in <b>n</b> et)	Wave a net about catching insects.

	Pretty pink pig – $/p/$ , $/p/$ , $/p/$ . (pronounced $/p/$ as in $pig$ )	Put hands up to each side of head and waggle for ears of a pig.		
	Rusty robot – /r/, /r/, /r/. (pronounced /r/ as in robot)	Bend arms at elbow. Move lower arms up and down with a jerking motion.

	Measure the treasure - /s/, /s/, /s/. (pronounced /s/ as in treasure)	Hold both hands out palm upwards and move up and down gently measuring the mass of the treasure.		
	Chickens cheep - /ch/, /ch/, /ch/. (pronounced /ch/ as in chicken)	With bunched fingers, make beaks opening and shutting.		
	Shiny shell - /sh/, /sh/, /sh/. (pronounced /sh/ as in shell)	Rub an imaginary shell in the hand to shine, then hold up to admire for /sh/, /sh/, /sh/.		
<b>(S)</b>	Thick thongs, thin thongs – /th/, /th/, /th/. (pronounced /th/ as in thong)	Hands apart for thick thongs, close together for thin thongs, then tramp feet for /th/, /th/, /th/.		
	This feather, that feather – /th/, /th/, /th/. (pronounced /th/ as in feather)	Hold up a feather in left hand for <i>this feather</i> , and another in right hand for <i>that feather</i> . Twirl both around for / <i>th</i> /, / <i>th</i> /, / <i>th</i> /.
